c. Intelligence Officer (Various Agencies): Assess potential threats, identify risks, and provide recommendations related to national security, counterintelligence and foreign policy to law enforcement agencies, military personnel, and government officials.

d. Customs and Immigration Officer: Responsible for keeping national borders secure and safe from any illegal activities, managing inbound and outbound mobility of citizens and foreign nationals as well as enforcing immigration law like dealing with illegal immigrants, smuggling of migrants and human trafficking.

e. Corporate Compliance Officer: Develops, implements, and monitors internal policies and procedures to ensure compliance with relevant laws, regulations, industry standards and minimise risks associated with non-compliance in an organisation.

f. Internal Auditor: Responsible for assessing an organisation's internal controls, processes, and procedures to ensure compliance with laws, regulations, and best practices, as well as to identify areas for improvement in operational efficiency and effectiveness.

g. Risk Manager: Identify, analyse, and manage potential risks to the organisation including those related to international law, regulations, geopolitical developments and develop strategies to mitigate and manage these risks effectively.
