ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- A Bachelor's Degree (Level 6, Malaysian Qualifications Framework, MQF) in the field or related fields with a minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 2.75 or equivalent. Applicants with a degree from non-relevant fields will be required to pass the prerequisite requirements set by the university; OR
- → A Bachelor's Degree (Level 6, MQF) in the field or related fields or equivalent with a minimum CGPA of 2.50 and not meeting CGPA of 2.75, can be accepted subject to rigorous internal assessment; OR
- A Bachelor's Degree (Level 6, MQF) in the field or related fields or equivalent with minimum CGPA of 2.00 and not meeting CGPA of 2.50, can be accepted subject to a minimum of five years working experience in the relevant field and rigorous internal assessment.
- → Candidates without a related qualification in the field/s or working experience in the relevant fields must undergo appropriate prerequisite courses determined by the university and meet the minimum CGPA based on i to iii above.
- Any equivalent qualification recognized by the University Senate; and
- International applicants are required to have a minimum score of International English Language Testing System (IELTS) 6.0 or equivalent or have attained a degree from a university where the medium of instruction is in English.
